

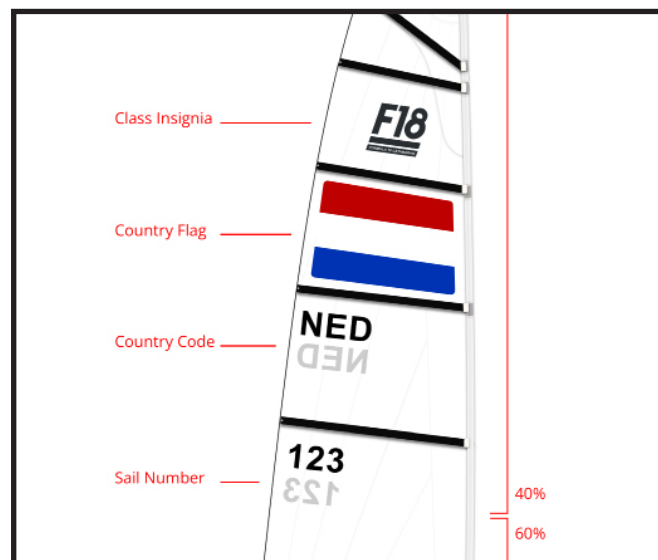
Nacra Sail Identification & Application

This manual is suited for both one (1) set of Country Codes and/or one (1) set of Sail Numbers

NOTE: All instructions in this manual are based on the World Sailing's Racing Rules of Sailing [RRS]. Please check individual Class Rules for deviations on these rules.

All Sail Identification stickers (Sail Number, Country Code, Flag and Class Insignia) must be placed in the upper 40% of your mainsail, if possible ¹.

Identification stickers must be placed in the following order (from top to bottom): Class Insignia - National Flag - Country Code - Sail Number ².

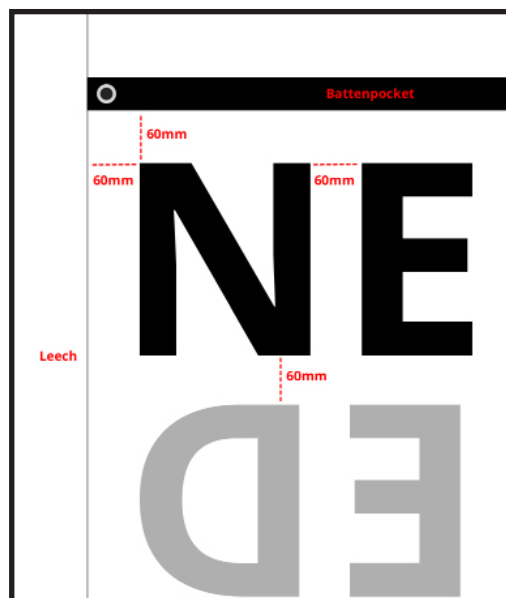


Tools needed:

- Measuring tape
- Any professional sail cleaner
- Roller, squeegee or credit card
- Fineliner or marker
- Clean dry cloth
- Ruler or painters tape

1. Position your mainsail on a hard and flat surface, starboard side up.
2. Thoroughly clean area of grease and dirt. Make sure your sail is completely dry before applying your stickers.
3. Get your measuring tape and locate the designated area for your identification stickers.
4. Measure a minimum of 60mm from the edge of the leech, and a minimum of 60mm from the bottom of the nearest upper battenpocket. This is your starting point.

DO NOT use acetone based components!



TIP: When placing the stickers on the each side, it is recommended you draw help lines keeping in mind the 60mm gap, to keep your stickers straight. You can erase them easily with the sail cleaner.

5. Place the upper-leftmost tip of your sticker on the mark you made. Gently press it down and make sure it is adhering properly using a rubber roller.
6. Once adhered to the sail, peel off the top layer and measure 60mm from the rightmost edge of the sticker to mark the starting placement of the next one^{3,4}. Draw help lines if needed.
7. Once all stickers on the starboard side are properly adhered, preferably flatten them again with a rubber roller to remove any air pockets.

TIP: For more precise alignment before sticking: Peel a small piece of bottom layer from one corner of the sticker and fold it over on itself before application.

8. Flip over your sail, and make sure you can properly see the bottom edge of your placed stickers.
9. Measure 60mm down from the bottom edge of your placed stickers to mark the starting placement on the port side.
10. Repeat steps 5 to 7 on the port side. Check if all stickers are properly adhered to the sail.

¹ - Due to space constraints, this is impossible on most Nacra sails. Consult your Class Rules for required placement.

² - Some Classes do not require National Flags. Consult your Class rules for requirements.

³ - On Nacra 15 sails only, it is allowed to place both Country Code and Sail Number on the same row, e.g. NED 123. Keep a gap of at least 60mm between stickers if possible.

⁴ - Sometimes with larger letters, this is not possible on Nacra 15 sails. In that case, keep a gap of at least 60mm between Country Code and Sail Number. Consult your Class Rules for required placements.
